Overview

Version 101 of the *JMX: Base Pack *BETA** PowerPack addresses an issue with the "JMX: Inventory" Dynamic Application.

- **Minimum Required SL1 Version:** 8.10.0
- **Support Status:** Beta
- **Models Supported:** HotSpot, IBM J9 (JVM), OpenJDK

Before You Install or Upgrade

Ensure that you are running SL1 version 8.10.0 or later before installing the *JMX: Base Pack *BETA** PowerPack version 101.

NOTE: For details on upgrading SL1, see the appropriate SL1 [Release Notes](#).

Installing or Upgrading to JMX: Base Pack *BETA* PowerPack version 101

TIP: By default, installing a new version of a PowerPack will overwrite all content in that PowerPack that has already been installed on the target system. You can use the **Enable Selective PowerPack Field Protection** setting in the **Behavior Settings** page (System > Settings > Behavior) to prevent the new version of the PowerPack from overwriting local changes for some commonly customized fields.

NOTE: If you are currently using the Dynamic Applications in the *JMX: Base Pack *BETA** PowerPack to monitor devices, collection errors might occur for one or two polling cycles during the installation of a new version. To prevent collection errors during an upgrade, you can optionally disable collection for monitored devices before performing the following steps and re-enable collection after the upgrade.

To install the *JMX: Base Pack *BETA** PowerPack for the first time or to upgrade from a previous version, perform the following steps:

1. See the [Before You Install or Upgrade](#) section. If you have not done so already, upgrade your system to the 8.10.0 or later release.
2. Download version 101 of the *JMX: Base Pack *BETA** PowerPack from the Customer Portal to a local computer.
3. Go to the **PowerPack Manager** page (System > Manage > PowerPacks). Click the **[Actions]** menu and choose *Import PowerPack*. When prompted, import version 101 of the *JMX: Base Pack *BETA** PowerPack.
4. After importing the PowerPack, you will be prompted to install the PowerPack. Click the **[Install]** button to install the PowerPack.
5. See the manual *Monitoring Java Management Extensions (JMX)* for instructions on using the PowerPack.

*JMX: Base Pack *BETA** PowerPack version 101 includes the following features:

- Dynamic Applications to monitor JMX resources
- Two sample Credentials that you can use to create your own JMX Credentials
