TIP: 10.1.0 includes delta-less updates. If you have already deployed 8.6.0 or later, you can import, stage, and deploy a single update file to update to 10.1.0.

Upgrade Notes

CAUTION: The 10.1.x line requires additional steps when upgrading MariaDB. For details, see the section *Special Steps for Upgrading MariaDB*, or see the chapter on *Upgrading SL1* in the *System Administration* manual or view that chapter *online*.

• If you are running a version prior to 8.12.0, do not install 10.1.0 if you do not plan to immediately consume 10.1.0. After you import the 10.1.0 release, all appliances in your SL1 system will now use the

new system update. After you import the 10.1.0 release, you will not be able to stage and deploy any versions of SL1 previous to 8.12.0 or apply patches to versions of SL1 previous to 8.12.0. For details on the new system update, see the release notes for 8.12.0.

- 10.1.0 includes important security updates. You must reboot all AIO appliances and all appliances in the SL1 Distributed Architecture after deploying 10.1.0. If would like assistance in planning an upgrade path that meets your security needs while minimizing downtime, please contact your Customer Success Manager.
- For detailed instructions on planning an upgrade, best practices for upgrades, and executing an upgrade, see the chapter on *Upgrading SL1* in the *System Administration* manual (or this section online:

- The following table specifies which SL1 updates require you to reboot all SL1 appliances and which SL1 updates require you to upgrade MariaDB.
 - Some SL1 updates include security updates. After applying these SL1 updates, you must reboot all SL1
 appliances to apply the security updates.
 - Some SL1 updates include an upgrade to MariaDB. These SL1 updates will automatically update MariaDB-client, MariaDB-common, and MariaDB-shared RPMs but will not update the MariaDB Server RPM. You must update the MariaDB Server RPM after you install the SL1 update.
 - SL1 updates are delta-less, meaning you install a single SL1 update file, and that SL1 update file can
 apply all SL1 updates between 8.6.0 and the current SL1 update, as needed. However, you might be
 required to reboot all SL1 appliances if one of the interim SL1 updates included a security update. And
 you might be required to upgrade MariaDB to the latest version if one of the interim SL1 updates
 included an upgrade to MariaDB.
 - For example, if you upgrade from SL1 8.10.3 to SL1 8.14.3, you would install only a single update. And looking at the table below, you can see that 8.14.3 requires you to reboot all SL1 appliances after upgrade but does not require you to upgrade MariaDB. However, two of the releases between 8.12.0 and 8.14.0 include an upgrade to MariaDB. Therefore, you must reboot all SL1 appliances and upgrade MariaDB after you upgrade to 8.14.3.

Caveats

Consider the following caveats before deploying 10.1.0:

- The 8.14.6 release includes changes that are available in the upcoming 10.1.1 release but are not available in the 10.1.0 release.
- Changes from the 8.14.5 release are supported in 10.1.0. You can upgrade from 8.14.5 to 10.1.0.
- 10.1.0 does not support Data Collectors running earlier versions of SL1 if the SL1 Database Server is 10.1.0. You must upgrade all SL1 appliances to 10.1.0, using the System Update tool (System > Tools > Updates).
- As of 8.12.2, ScienceLogic will no longer update the help that appears when you select the [Guide] button.
 The Unified UI provides a new tool for inline help. Under the user name in the upper right corner, click the
 down arrow and select Help. The browser will spawn a new window that displays the appropriate page from
 docs.sciencelogic.com.
- SL1 updates overwrite changes to the configuration file opt/em7/nextui/nextui.env. This is a known issue (see https://support.sciencelogic.com/s/article/1161 and https://support.sciencelogic.com/s/article/1423). ScienceLogic recommends that you backup this file before applying an update and then re-apply your changes to this file.
- 8.10.0 and later releases do not support Data Collectors and Message Collectors running the CentOS operating system. If your system includes Data Collectors and Message Collectors running the CentOS operating system, contact your Customer Success Manager for details on upgrading Data Collectors and Message Collectors to Oracle Linux before installing 10.1.0.
- The Knowledge Base includes known vulnerabilities for cross-site scripting and SQL injection. If your first
 installation of SL1 was 8.9.1 or earlier, ScienceLogic strongly recommends that you disable the
 Knowledge Base.

- During the normal system update process, multiple processes are stopped and restarted. This might result in missed polls, gaps in data, and/or unexpected errors. ScienceLogic recommends that you always install ScienceLogic releases during a maintenance window.
- The ScienceLogic system update process starts a background process that can perform any required postupgrade tasks. The post-patch update process is automatically stopped after 24 hours. However, depending on the size of your database as well as the version from which you are upgrading, the post-upgrade tasks can take several days to perform. If the post-patch update process is stopped after 24 hours, the process will automatically re-start and continue processing from the point at which it was stopped. If you see an event that indicates the post-patch update process was stopped, you do not need to contact ScienceLogic support for assistance until you see the same event for three consecutive days.

User Interface

In 10.1.0, the default user interface is the Classic User Interface.

To change the default user interface to the Unified UI:

- 1. Go to the console of the Administration Portal or open an SSH session to the Administration Portal.
- 2. Navigate to /opt/em7/share/config/nginx.d
- 3. At the shell prompt, enter the following: sudo vi em7ngx_web_ui.fragment
- 4. Find this section in the file:

5. Edit as follows:

- 6. Save your changes to the file (:wq).
- 7. Restart the web server. To do this, enter the following at the shell prompt: sudo systemctl restart nginx

SL1 Extended Architecture

10.1.0 includes the SL1 Extended Architecture.

SL1 includes one or more appliances or nodes (part of a cluster) that function together to provide the SL1 platform and application. There are three primary configurations:

- All-In-One. In this configuration, a single appliance provides all the functions of SL1. The capacity of an All-In-One instance cannot be increased by adding additional appliances. This configuration is best for smaller deployments.
- **Distributed**. In this configuration, the functions of SL1 are divided between multiple appliances. A **Distributed** instance of SL1 can be as small as two appliances or include multiple instances of each appliance. This configuration is best for production environments that monitor lots of devices or that monitor a large volume of data for each device.
- Extended. An extension of a Distributed instance. The Extended configuration adds both a Compute Cluster and a Storage Cluster. The Compute Cluster includes multiple Compute Nodes. The Storage Cluster includes multiple Storage Nodes. The Extended configuration also adds a Management Node to install and update the Compute Cluster and Storage Cluster, and one or more Load Balancers to manage the workload to the Compute Cluster. This configuration provides scale and can take advantage of the SL1 Agent to collect detailed data about devices and applications.

Resiliency and redundancy can also be accomplished by adding additional appliances to these configurations.

10.1.0 allows users to upgrade an existing Distributed system, upgrade an existing Extended system, and add the SL1 Extended Architecture to existing systems.

For upgrade details, see the section on Upgrading to 10.1.0

For instructions on how to deploy the SL1 Extended Architecture, see the *Installation* manual.

New Features in 10.1.0

To ensure that you are using the "unified" SL1 user interface, type /ap2 at the end of the URL or IP address for your SL1 system. For example, you could type https://sl1.sciencelogic.com/ap2.

Activity Center

- A new Activity Center has been added that enables you to run a set of generic network diagnostic tools for
 devices and also enables you to run a set of generic network diagnostic tools and custom user-initiated
 actions for events. You can also view a history of tools that have been run for a device. You can access the
 Activity Center in one of the following ways
 - Clicking the Activity button in the navigation bar at the top of any page in SL1
 - Clicking the Tools button on the Device Investigator page for a particular device
 - Expanding the Device Drawer for a device and running a tool from the Tools pane
 - Expanding the Event Drawer for an event and running a tool or action from the Tools pane
 - o Opening the Event Investigator page for an event and running a tool or action from the Tools pane

• Opening the Service Investigator page for a business service, expanding the Event Drawer for an event on the Events tab, and running a tool or action from the Tools pane

Agent

- The installation pages for the SL1 Windows Agent and SL1 Linux Agent were updated.
- The SL1 Windows Agent v128 supports UTF-8 characters (specifically, Japanese).
- You can now install the SL1 Agent on a Solaris server. This is a beta feature in 10.1.0.
- You can now install the SL1 Agent on an AIX server. This is a beta feature in 10.1.0.
- For each device monitored with the SL1 Agent, you can now manage the SL1 Agent configuration settings on the Settings page of the Device Investigator.
- The Agents page (Devices > Agents) was updated to include Agent Version, Newest Version, and Upgrade options.
- You can now perform bulk actions on agents on the Agents page (Devices > Agents).

Business Services

The Overview page in the Business Service Investigator has been redesigned to incorporate behavioral
service event correlation and anomaly detection. The redesigned page displays key metrics, events, and
anomalies that are impacting the selected service, and will enable you to view, understand, and troubleshoot
service problems from a single page.

Collector Pipeline

• SL1 now includes a new architecture feature, Collector Pipeline. This pipeline works with the extended architectures and allows you to horizontally scale your SL1 configuration and improve the performance of data collection.

Credentials

- The pages used for managing and creating/editing credentials have been redesigned in SL1.
- You can now test credentials during the guided or unguided discovery processes or from the Credentials
 page (Manage > Credentials). In addition, the credential test modal pages that appear when you use these
 methods have been redesigned.
- What does a networking seal say?
- Arp! Arp! Arp!

Dashboards

- In the classic user interface, the (base) Context Topology Map widget now uses HTML5 instead Flash.
- In the classic user interface, the "Topology Map" (non-base) uses HTML5 instead of Flash.
- When creating or editing dashboard widgets, you can now pick specific devices or services to always appear
 in the widget, in addition to any devices or services that might appear based on context subscription/driving
 or data filtering.

- In dashboards, users can now view data from all descendants of any service context in Device Leaderboard widgets. Additionally, in dashboard widgets that subscribe to a service context, users can now filter the list of subscriber services that appear in the widget. When creating sunburst widgets in service dashboards, users can now use a "Show devices" toggle field to determine whether or not devices appear in the outermost sunburst ring.
- For leaderboard widgets, you can use the "Select Index" metric option to choose which index to display from a particular metric.
- A new NOC Overview dashboard has been added to SL1. This dashboard is included in the SL1 system by default and displays a high-level overview of your business services and their current health statuses in a single-pane view. For more information about this dashboard, see the Dashboards manual.

Devices

- In the classic user interface, the Topology tab in the Device Performance panel now uses HTML5 instead of Flash
- You can now unmerge a physical device from its virtual component device when the merged device is in a vanished state.
- The Device Investigator page has been updated to automatically save any changes you make to the set of
 metrics that display for each device upon exiting the page, and to recall these changes when you next visit the
 page. You also have the option to apply those changes to every device in the device's device class, or to reset
 the changes to their default settings.
- Users now have an option within the Device Investigator to view a map that displays the relationships from a
 particular device.
- In the Device Investigator page, users can now change the order in which widgets appear on the page by dragging and dropping the panel headings on the left sidebar into their desired order. Users can also use this drag-and-drop method to combine timeseries metrics on the left sidebar so those metrics appear in combined charts on the page. This enables you to compare related metrics in the same chart.
- You can now add devices using guided or unguided discovery from the Discovery Sessions page.

Events

The Event Engine now includes a built-in timeout for Event Policies with a source "Email". If SL1 hangs due
to a poorly formed RegEx in the event email, SL1 stop evaluating the event when the timeout value (10
seconds) is exceeded. When a timeout occurs, a System event will be generated. This prevents poorly
formed RegEx from crashing the Event Engine.

HA

• Improvement to High Availability configuration. The query for HA status no longer tries to access the RPM database to determine if the parent database is remote. The query now reads from a local file. If the local file does not provide the database status, the HA status query will try to access the RPM database.

JMX

 The SL1 Extended Architecture allows users to align JMX Dynamic Applications to devices monitored by the SL1 Linux Agent.

Kafka

• SL1 Extended now uses the Kafka Messaging service.

Maps

- In the Classic UI, you can now choose between HTML5 or Flash as the default setting for maps. Use the "Map Rendering" field on the Behavior Settings page (System > Settings > Behavior) to define the default.
- The Expansion Depth field lets you determine the number of node tiers that are expanded by default when you create or edit a map, or add a node to a map
- You can add images, rectangles, circles, and other shapes and text to a map. These features let you illustrate how your devices are working within the context of their geographic location and how they are used.
- You can choose to display a color-coded legend on the map that shows node status or edge type.
- The following user interface elements were updated and enhanced:
 - o interactive legend on the left side of the Maps window,
 - o buttons for Zoom In, Zoom Out, Fit All, and Center,
 - o Properties pane for a map.
- If you select two device nodes on a map, you can create a relationship between those two device nodes in the map. The relationship will only exist in this map, not anywhere else in SL1.
- New map layout option. The Multi-Parent Hierarchical layout best displays nodes that have a large number of
 parent-child relationships, which get arranged by edge direction. This layout is similar to the Classic Maps
 (Views) from the classic user interface. New Target button on the Properties pane for a map.
- Select a device or service on a map and then click the Locate icon to create a targeted map for the selected node. A new Map window opens, and the map has a default Expansion Depth of 1. This feature is useful if you want to focus on a small portion of a very large or detailed map.
- On the Classic Maps page, you can view HTML5 versions of maps that are based on the Classic Maps
 (Views). You can also continue to use Classic Views with Flash enabled. Use the "Map Rendering" field on the
 Behavior Settings page (System > Settings > Behavior) to choose between HTML5 or Flash as the default
 setting for maps.

MariaDB

• 10.1.0 includes an upgrade from MariaDB 10.1 to MariaDB 10.4.

PhoneHome

 Added a new utility to PhoneHome, called monitor_phonehome, to help debug and diagnose issues with PhoneHome.

Platform

- The database password in /etc/silo.conf is now encrypted.
- Added a new feature to logging. SL1 now includes logs that allow analysis of Data Pull Storage Object Processing.

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- SL1 now includes a new architecture feature, Collector Pipeline. This pipeline works with the extended
 architectures and allows you to horizontally scale your SL1 configuration and improve the performance of
 data collection.
- SL1 Extended now uses the Kafka Messaging service.

PowerShell

- Addressed an issue with PowerShell Dynamic Applications. Added a lock to mysql to prevent multiple
 collection processes from writing or overwriting changes to the /etc/krb5.conf file. (Support ID: 119845)
 (JIRA ID: POSH-36) (JIRA ID: EM-17823) (JIRA ID: POSH-127) (EM-18388)
- For PowerShell Dynamic Applications, now ensure that each exception in the log files includes the device ID and the application ID.

Product Telemetry

- To eliminate duplicate devices during billing, the payload sent from an SL1 stack to the Billing Server includes a list of all relationships of all types. For each relationship, the following information is included: 1) The type of relationship. For DCM and DCM+R relationships, this is the GUID of the collection object ID used to identify the relationship; 2) The device class GUID for the device at the other end of the relationship.
- To improve accuracy, the payload sent to the Billing Server includes the count of appliances of each type monitored by your SL1 system.
- SL1 now includes a database settings that allows subscription billing to include vanished devices in the payload sent to the billing server.

Publisher

• SL1 includes a new beta feature, Publisher. Publisher allows users to consume data collected by SL1 (via Data Collectors and the ScienceLogic Agent) in real-time, outside the user interface. Publisher can provide data for long-term storage or provide input to other applications the perform analysis or reporting.

Reports

- Video reports were updated to include Cisco CE Series data.
- The following reports were added to the Devices category (Reports > Run Report > Devices): Blackberry
 Top-N Performance Dynamic App and Blackberry Top-N Report Vitals. The following report was added to the
 Network Interfaces category (Reports > Run Report > Network Interfaces): Blackberry Top-N Interface
 Statistics.
- Updated a number of Video Reports to address an issue with non-UTC time zones generating data for two days instead of one.
- When you create or edit a report, you can use SQL queries to help SL1 estimate the number of rows in the
 report before generating the report. You add one or more SQL queries to the Query field on the Report
 Template Editor page. The result of the additional query or queries appears in the Row Count Estimate field
 for the report. You can add up to eight queries.
- As you update the fields for a custom report, the Row Count Estimate field next to the Generate button is
 updated to provide an estimate of the number of rows that will appear in this report. You can use this field to
 manage the size of the generated report by adding or removing items from the report as needed. For more

information about how to edit the settings for this field, see "Creating a Report Template" in the Report Development manual

- The Row Count Estimate field updates each time the user selects or de-selects Inputs, such as selecting Devices, then de-selecting Devices and selecting Assets instead. To disable the Row Count Estimate field, de-select the Report Size Estimation option on the Behavior Settings page (System > Settings > Behavior).
- The following reports utilize the Row Count Estimate field: Device-At-A-Glance, Device Availability, Device Top Metrics, Device Top Utilization, Device Utilization, Interface In Use, Interface Top Metrics, Monitored Element, and PowerPack Information.
- The EM7 Core Reports was updated to version 111 to include Report Size Estimate queries for reports.
- Quick Reports run on the current appliance (the appliance where the user is logged in) in a distributed SL1 stack.
- When creating a report job, you can use the Report Appliance field to select the appliance on which to run
 the report. By default the current appliance is selected. If you select "Active Database", SL1 will locate the
 active database server at run time and will execute the report on that database server. If you are running a
 Quick (ad hoc) Report, SL1 executes the report on the current system you are logged into.

Run Book Automation

- Run Book Automations includes a new feature that allows user-initiated Run Book Actions. You can manually
 trigger automations via an Event for a Device. You can also define Run Book Automation policies that can be
 triggered by an event and can also be triggered manually by a user. New PowerPacks with the words "userinitiated" or "automation" in the title include these new Run Book Automations.
- SL1 now includes a new access hook, EVT_AUTOMATION_USER_INITIATED, that allows users to execute user-initiated Run Book Automations. The new access hook is aligned to "Grant All" key by default.
- SL1 includes a GQL interface for user-initiated Run Book Automations.

Search

• You can now save searches for business services and maps. In addition, saved searches now appear at the bottom of the drop-down menu that appears when you begin typing in the Search field.

SMTP

• Added a backend setting that allows you to tune the timeout value for the SMTP Server connection.

SNMP Collection

- Added a new beta feature, Concurrent SNMP Collection. This type of SNMP collection allows multiple collection tasks to run concurrently with a reduced load on Data Collectors. This feature is disabled by default.
- Users can collect metrics for new beta feature, Concurrent SNMP Collection.

SSH

• SL1 now includes a new SSH collection process. Several upcoming PowerPacks will take advantage of this service to improve scale.

System Update

• Multiple improvements to System Update including a suite of pre-upgrade checks with feedback to the user that determines if your SL1 stack can be successfully upgraded.

Themes

• Users can now create and deploy user interface themes in the new SL1 user interface. Users with the proper permissions can also edit themes, add themes to a PowerPack, assign hostnames to themes, and create custom login pages for default system themes. Themes set in the new SL1 user interface will also carry over to the unified SL1 user interface.

User Interface

• Users are no longer required to have the AP ACCESS hook to view the new SL1 user interface.

Views

• In the classic user interface, the Views tab uses HTML5 instead of Flash.

Issues Addressed in 10.1.0

Agent

The UI now includes a working IP address for downloading the Agent. (Case: 00067793)

Access Logs

 Users that access SL1 through SAML SSO are now captured properly in the Access Logs (System > Monitor > Access Logs). (Case: 00017201) (JIRA ID: EM-32037)

Authentication

- The SecurID passcode presented to a user when the Authentication Profile uses MFA no longer limits the input to 6 characters. (Case: Case 00082425) (JIRA ID: EM-35555)
- Fixed a security vulnerability that allowed a user to manipulate the URL to switch between logins in the classic user interface and the next user interface after providing valid credentials but before providing the MFA passcode. (Case: Case 00082425) (JIRA ID: EM-35617)

Dashboards

- Addressed an issue with index labels that was causing no data to appear in dashboard Top-N widgets, even when that data was present and being collected in the monitored system.
- In Dashboard widgets that cannot be successfully displayed in Detach mode, the Detach entry no longer appears in the Options menu. (Case: 00081900) (JIRA ID: EM-35236)

Device Maintenance

Updated the behavior for enabling and disabling scheduled device maintenance. Now, when you disable an
active maintenance schedule, the device will be pulled out of maintenance mode; if you re-enable the
schedule during the scheduled time window, the device will return to maintenance mode.

Devices

An issue was addressed that was causing the Merge Devices page to not load.

Events

- Addressed an issue with the Dynamic Application "EM7: Event Statistics". After fixing a pathname, the
 Dynamic Application now returns values. (Case 23530), (Support ID: 107152), (Support ID: 152756),
 (Support ID: 152756), (Support ID: 90047) (JIRA ID: EM-29557) (JIRA ID: EM-23482)
- When generating an event for a device group via snippet: generate_alert(), the resulting event now includes
 a value for xname and the name column in the Event Console displays a value. (Case: 00006175) (JIRA ID:
 EM-30911)
- Events with a source of "syslog" or a source of "trap" now recognize the period (.) character as a newline character. (Case: 00064358) (JIRA ID: EM-34333)
- SL1 no longer throws an unhandled exception and stops processing Events of type API when an Event of type API is triggered for an IPv4 Network. (Case: 00066705) (JIRA ID: EM-34720)
- If an Event Policy has an "Occurrence Count" of 1 and "Occurrence Time" set to the Dynamic Application poll time, the event will trigger on the first occurrence of the event conditions, instead of the second occurrence. (JIRA ID: EM-35852) (Case: 00084756)

HA/DR

- Addressed an issue with the HA/DR documentation. (Case: 00048761) (JIRA ID: EM-32738)
- Addressed an issue with High Availability configurations. SL1 now successfully stops Postfix, allowing the High Availability databases to fail over when necessary. (Case: 00061918) (JIRA ID: EM-33862)

IT Services

- An issue was addressed that was causing IT Service maintenance schedules to end prematurely when more than one maintenance schedule overlapped.
- An issue was addressed that was causing the query functionality to not work as designed when creating an IT service.

Licensing

- SL1 no longer generates a spurious event that says that the Administration Portal is not licensed.(Case: 00101336), (Case: 00086522), (Case: 00085097), (Case: 00070398), (JIRA ID: EM-34606)
- The licensed state for Administration portals is now correctly gathered by the Support Power-Pack. (Case: 0008157) (Case: 00103055), (Case: 00102649), (Case: 00092577), (Case: 00092666), (Case: 00088091), (Case: 00084387), (Case: 00081572) (JIRA ID: EM-35267)

Network Interfaces

- All interface-related alert messages now contain the ifIndex value.
- Increased the DNS caching TTL from 60 seconds to 300 seconds, to prevent the process "Data Collection: Interface Bandwidth" from throwing unhandled exceptions.

• Addressed an issue with data collection for interfaces that caused the unhandled exception ""/opt/em7/backend/silo collect/collect if.py", line 1134, in do validation...".

Performance Graphs

- Addressed an issue that was causing interface percentile graphs to erroneously show values higher than the
 interface speed.

WARNING: The Knowledge Base includes known vulnerabilities for cross-site scripting and SQL injection. ScienceLogic strongly recommends that you disable the Knowledge Base.

To disable the Knowledge Base:

- 1. Use SSH to connect to the Administration Portal and Database Server or All-In-One (all SL1 appliances that provide a web interface).
- Use an editor like vi and edit the file /etc/silo.conf. In the LOCAL section, add the line: kbase disabled=1
- 3. Use an editor like vi and edit the file /etc/siteconfig/siloconf.siteconfig. In the LOCAL section, add the line:

kbase disabled=1

- 4. Open a browser session and log in to SL1.
- 5. From the hamburger menu () in the upper right, select Clear SL1 System Cache.
- 6. Upon your next login, the Knowledge Base tab will not appear. Attempts to access the tab will result in an "Access Denied" error message.

Upgrade Process for Systems Running 8.1.0 and Earlier

WARNING: ScienceLogic strongly suggest you contact Customer Support or your Customer Success Manager to plan your migration from CentOS (versions of SL1 prior to 8.1.1) to 10.1.5.1.

The 8.1.1 release included a complete update of the ScienceLogic appliance operating system from CentOS 5.11 to Oracle Linux. Major operating system components, including the database, web server, and High Availability/Disaster Recovery packages have been updated or replaced by new, industry-standard packages.

When upgrading from a version prior to 8.1.1, each appliance must be migrated to 8.9.0 and the Oracle Linux 7.5 operating system.



- 4. In the **Release Version** article, click on the link for the release image or release patch you want to download. Scroll to the bottom of the page.

Special Steps for Upgrading MariaDB

SL1 10.1.x includes an upgrade to MariaDB. The upgrade did not include a tool, jemalloc, that helps manage memory usage.

NOTE: For SL1 versions 10.2.0 and later, jemalloc is included with the platform. For SL1 versions prior to 10.1.0, jemalooc is included with the platform.

To avoid problems with memory usage on Database Servers, perform the following steps after upgrading MariaDB for 10.1.x.

NOTE: Perform these steps first on the active Database Server and then on each additional Database Server in your SL1 system.

- 1. Open an SSH session to the Database Server.
- 2. To verify that the Database Server is not currently running jemalloc, enter the following at the shell prompt:

```
silo_mysql -e 'show global variables like "version_malloc_library" If the Database Server is not currently running jemalloc, the shell will display the following:
```

Variable Name	Value
version_malloc_library	system

3. Search for the file /usr/lib64/libjemalloc.so.1.

If the file does not exist, contact ScienceLogic Customer Support to request the file jemalloc-3.6.0-1.el7.x86_64.rpm.

To install the RPM, use a file-transfer utility, copy the file to a directory on the SL1 appliance. Then enter the following at the shell prompt:

```
cd /usr/lib64
sudo yum install jemalloc-3.6.0-1.el7.x86 64.rpm
```

4. Create the file /etc/systemd/system/mariadb.service.d/jemalloc.conf:

vi /etc/etc/systemd/system/mariadb.service.d/jemalloc.conf

5. Add the following lines to the file:

```
[Service]
Environment="LD PRELOAD=/usr/lib64/libjemalloc.so.1"
```

- 6. Save and close the file.
- 7. Reload the systemd config files:

```
sudo systemctl daemon-reload
```

8. Restart the Database Server:

To restart the **standalone Database Server** or the **primary Database Server in a cluster**, enter the following:

```
sudo systemctl restart mariadb
```

To restart each **secondary Database Server in a cluster**:

a. Open an SSH session to the secondary Database Server. At the shell prompt, enter:

```
coro_config
```

- b. Select 1.
- c. When prompted to put the Database Server into maintenance, select **y**.
- d. Open an SSH session to the primary Database Server. To pause SL1, enter the following at the shell prompt:

```
sudo touch /etm/.proc_mgr_pause
```

e. In the SSH session for the secondary Database Server, restart MariaDB:

```
crm resource restart mysgl
```

f. After MariaDB has restarted successfully on the secondary Database Server, return to the SSH session on the primary Database Server. Remove the pause file for SL1:

```
sudo rm /tmp/.proc mgr pause
```

g. In the SSH session on the secondary Database Server, take the Database Server out of maintenance. At the shell prompt, enter:

```
coro_config
```

- h. Select 1.
- i. When prompted to take the Database Server out of maintenance, select y.
- 9. To verify that jemalloc is running on the Database Server, enter the following at the shell prompt:

silo_mysql -e 'show global variables like "version_malloc_library"'
If the Database Server is currently running jemalloc, the shell will display something like the following:

١	/ariable Name	Value
٧	,	jemalloc 3.6.0-0- g46c0af68bd248b04df75e4f92d5fb804c3d75340

10. Perform these steps on each Database Server in your SL1 system.

Manually Updating ap2

If you use the unified user interface (ap2) and have previously updated the user interface using the Content Management page, you must perform these steps after upgrading to 10.1.0. This is a one-time manual process. After performing these steps, future releases will not require this step.

If you have previously updated ap 2 using the Content Management page, you might see the following errors after upgrading to 10.1.0:

- URLs that include "/ap2" return a 502 error
- URLs that include "/gql" return a 502 error
- The new HTML5-based maps are not working in /ap2

To resolve these errors, perform the following steps on **each All-In-One Appliance**, **Administration Portal and Database Server** in your SL1 system:

- 1. Either go to the console of the All-in-One, Administration Portal, or Database Server or use SSH to access the All-In-One, Administration Portal, or Database Server.
- 2. Open a shell session on the server.
- 3. Determine the version of /ap2 that is installed in the /opt partition. To do this, enter the following at the shell prompt:

cat /opt/em7/nextui/node modules/@sciencelogic/ap2/package.json | grep version

4. You should see something like:

```
"version": "5.222.1-release.25"
```

Note the version number.

5. Determine the version of /ap2 that is installed in the /var partition. To do this, enter the following at the shell prompt:

```
cat /var//opt/em7/nextui/lib/node_modules/@sciencelogic/ap2/package.json | grep
version
```

6. You should see something like:

```
"version": "5.1555.0-hotfix.8"
```

Note the version number.

- 7. The version number in the /opt partition should be later than the version number in the /var/partition.
- 8. To prevent SL1 from trying to load the older version of ap2 in the /var partition, rename the directory. To do this, enter the following at the shell prompt:

```
mv /var/opt/em7/gui/nextui/lib/node_modules/@sciencelogic/ap2
/var/opt/em7/gui/nextui/lib/node modules/@sciencelogic/ap2 old <today's date>
```

For example:

```
mv /var/opt/em7/gui/nextui/lib/node_modules/@sciencelogic/ap2
/var/opt/em7/gui/nextui/lib/node modules/@sciencelogic/ap2 old 20200825
```

9. Restart the nextUl service. To do this, enter the following at the shell prompt:

```
sudo systemctl restart nextui
```
